### Administrative Records

• Administrative Records are existing records created by federal, state, and commercial agencies as they administer their programs.

 Integrating survey data with administrative records data can allow us to produce timely and relevant statistics despite falling survey responses rates.

• The process of acquiring and linking administrative data can be complex and time intensive.





### Quick overview: SNAP

#### SNAP is the largest program aimed at reducing domestic hunger by providing low-income households with benefits than can be used to purchase food at authorized retailers

 In Fiscal Year 2023, SNAP reached an average of 42 million participants each month

#### Monthly SNAP Participation, 2000-2022





### Quick overview: WIC

- WIC provides food, nutrition education, breastfeeding promotion and support, and referrals to health care and social services to nutritionally at-risk, low-income pregnant women, new mothers, infants, and children up to age 5
- In Fiscal Year 2023, WIC reached an average of 6.6 million people each month:
  - 1.5 million women
  - 1.5 million infants
  - 3.6 million children

#### Average Annual WIC Participation, 2000-2023





### Quick overview: TANF

 TANF provides block grants to states that use funds to provide income support to low-income families with children. States have flexibility to also use funds to provide a wide range of services.

• In Fiscal Year 2023, TANF benefits reached an average of 1.9 million people each month.

### Engaging with state agencies

- The Census Bureau has entered into agreements with state agencies to receive administrative data on SNAP, WIC, and TANF participants. This effort is supported by USDA's Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) and Economic Research Service (ERS).
- Initial outreach to state agencies involves:
  - Direct outreach by the Census Bureau to state agencies and/or governors offices
  - USDA FNS communication and grants
  - Participation in conferences with state program directors and FNS organized webinars
- Stakeholder engagement is a critical part of the process
  - Continued communication throughout process
  - Development of data products for states
  - Send research proposals and products to states
  - Engage efforts to renew agreements

• During the PVS process, unique person and address identifiers are assigned to the data and sensitive personally identifiable information are removed before data is made available to researchers

### How are these data being used?

- These data have been used to study survey responses of program receipt and poverty measurement as well as research efforts on producing population statistics using administrative records sources
  - Harris 2014, Colby et al. 2017, Fox et al. 2017, Rothbaum et al. 2021, Meyer et al. 2019, Brown and Murray-Close 2023.
- Additional ongoing research at Census Bureau and by research partners at USDA and external researchers with Special Sworn Status.
- Highlighting two projects
  - Estimating program eligibility and access at granular levels
  - SNAP Longitudinal Database





### Annual TANF table package


• Because TANF rules vary so much by state, we do not estimate program eligibility. Instead, we estimate TANF participation among children and adults living with children who are below the poverty line.



# Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Longitudinal Data Project (SNAP-LDP)

 The 2018 Farm Bill required FNS to develop a SNAP longitudinal research database and prior to approval, consult with Federal research agencies including the Census Bureau

 Goal is for the database to be used "solely to conduct research on participation in and the operation of the supplemental nutrition assistance program, including duration of participation in the program"





### Conclusion

- SNAP, WIC, and TANF data highlights the complexities of interagency data acquisition as well as the opportunities to create blended data products.
- The Census Bureau is continuing to reach out to states to develop data sharing agreements and acquire data on SNAP, WIC, and TANF participants. For states that share data, we continue to develop annual estimates of program participation, communicate results to states, and explore future innovations to our products.
- SNAP-LDP work will facilitate further research by creating a more standardized, documented database.
