

- 8. What aspects of HUD policies and programs supporting *aging-in-place for elders* need to be tailored to LGBTQI+ elders?
- 9. How do housing experiences and barriers to accessing and staying in decent, safe, and **affordable housing in opportunity neighborhoods** vary by sexual orientation and gender identity and vary based on intersecting identities like their race, ethnicity, age, disability status, and household type?
- 10. How do experiences applying for HUD subsidies and living in HUD-assisted housing for LGBTQI+ people differ based on intersecting identities like their race, ethnicity, age, disability status, and household type?

### **Efforts to include LGBTQI+ Individuals**

### CPD/SNAPS

 SNAPS office Gender Identity Standards Working Group of diverse partners, including people with lived experience and expertise, advocates, researchers, community and federal partners, HUD Technical Assistance Subject Matter Experts, and HUD staff to support inclusive and responsible SOGI data collection and use practices

### **FHEO**

 In December 2023 HUD principals began visits across the country to attend *listening sessions with LGBTQIA*+ youth and young adults with lived experience and will engage HUD grantees in identifying barriers to housing and shelter and effective methods of addressing those barriers.

- E.g., Final evaluation of the Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program was published May 2023.

- 9. How do housing experiences and barriers to accessing and staying in decent, safe, and affordable housing in opportunity neighborhoods vary by sexual orientation and gender identity and vary based on intersecting identities like their race, ethnicity, age, disability status, and household type?
- 10. How do experiences applying for HUD subsidies and living in HUD-assisted housing for LGBTQI+people differ based on intersecting identities like their race, ethnicity, age, disability status, and household type?



# PD&R anticipates growth in these areas as the newly collected data become available.

- Current work in progress on aging in place, supportive services
- Increased understanding of intersectionality, specifically on where people are living, crossing SOGI data with other demographic variables
- A study of barriers and access may also require a more qualitative approach.
